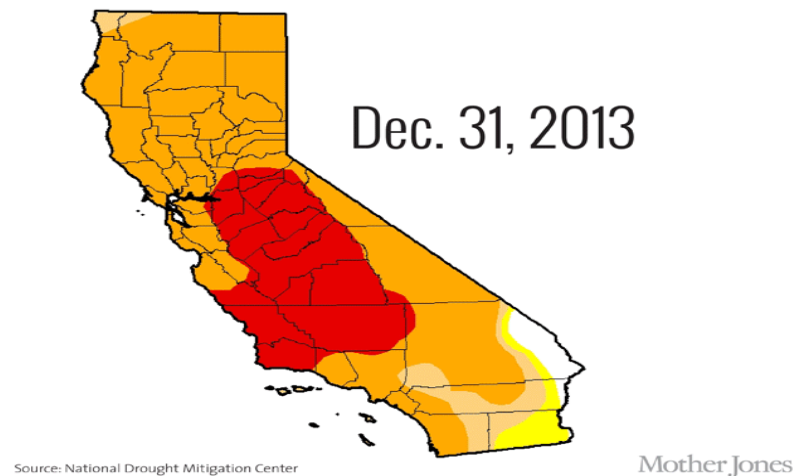

The Drying of California

The spread of California's drought, Dec. 31, 2013 - July 29, 2014

Abnormally Dry Moderate Severe Extreme Exceptional



Where: It was at California, but not just California, in some places

There was a worse drought in California. California is not a stranger to water droughts at all. In the picture above, you can see how worse it was in certain times.

When: It has been around for so long, way too long, and till this day it continues. On July 29, 2014, more than half of the state experienced an exceptional drought, or an abnormally dry water drought.

Why: It can get so dry because of the dynamic role the oceans play. Some people don't care about it and water gets to waste because of that.

How: When it was winter in 2011-2014, a high pressure of ridge off the west coast blocked the storms. Which also was bringing the need to California, during the wet season.

Who: The CEPA controls the water in California. CEPA stands for California Environmental Protection Agency. They enforced the pollution control laws and the overseas six state entities.

What: The drought killed 102 million trees in 2011-2016, with 62 million killed alone in 2016. The high pressure in the Pacific Ocean is the cause of the Water Drought.
