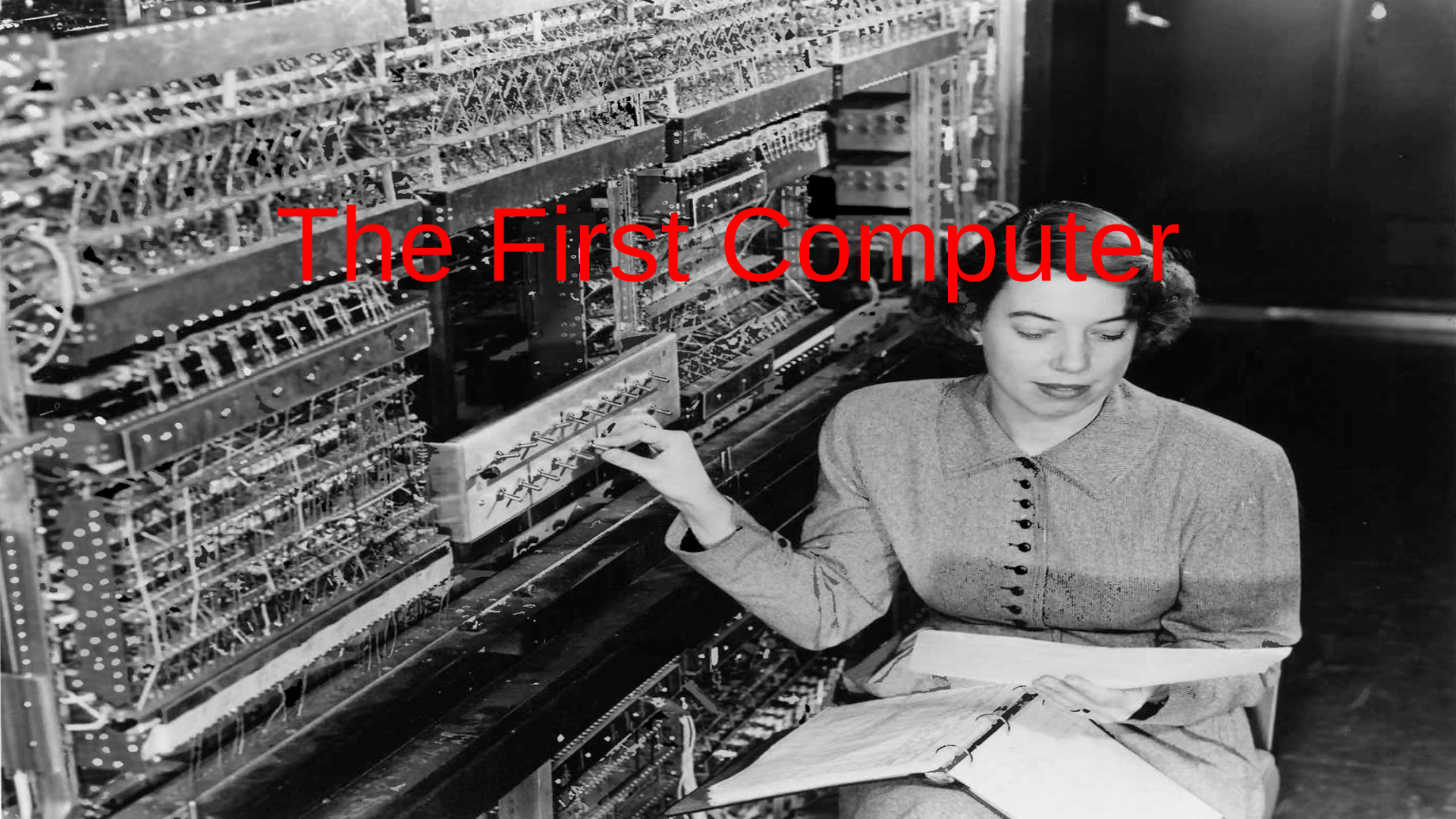
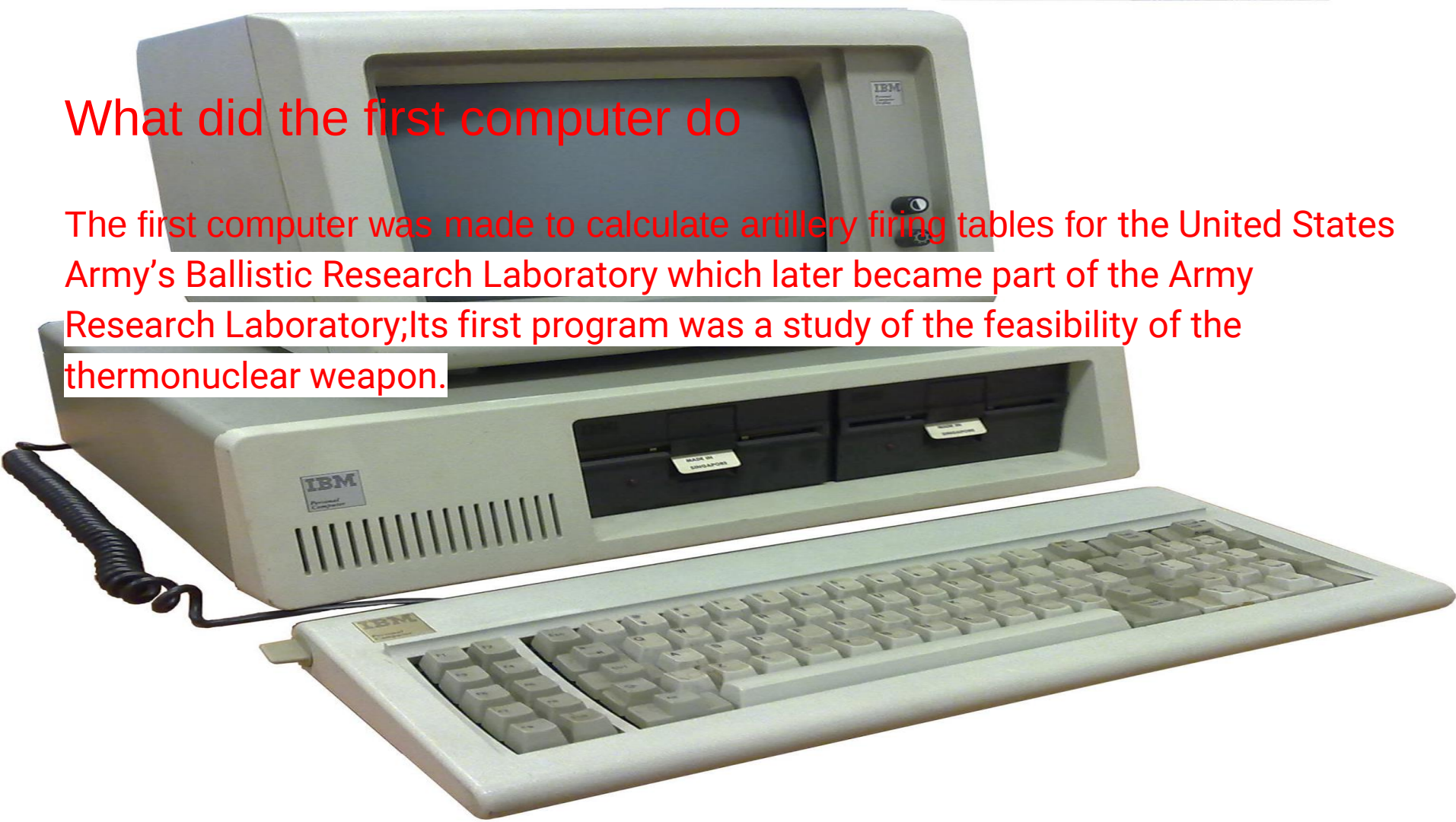


The First Computer

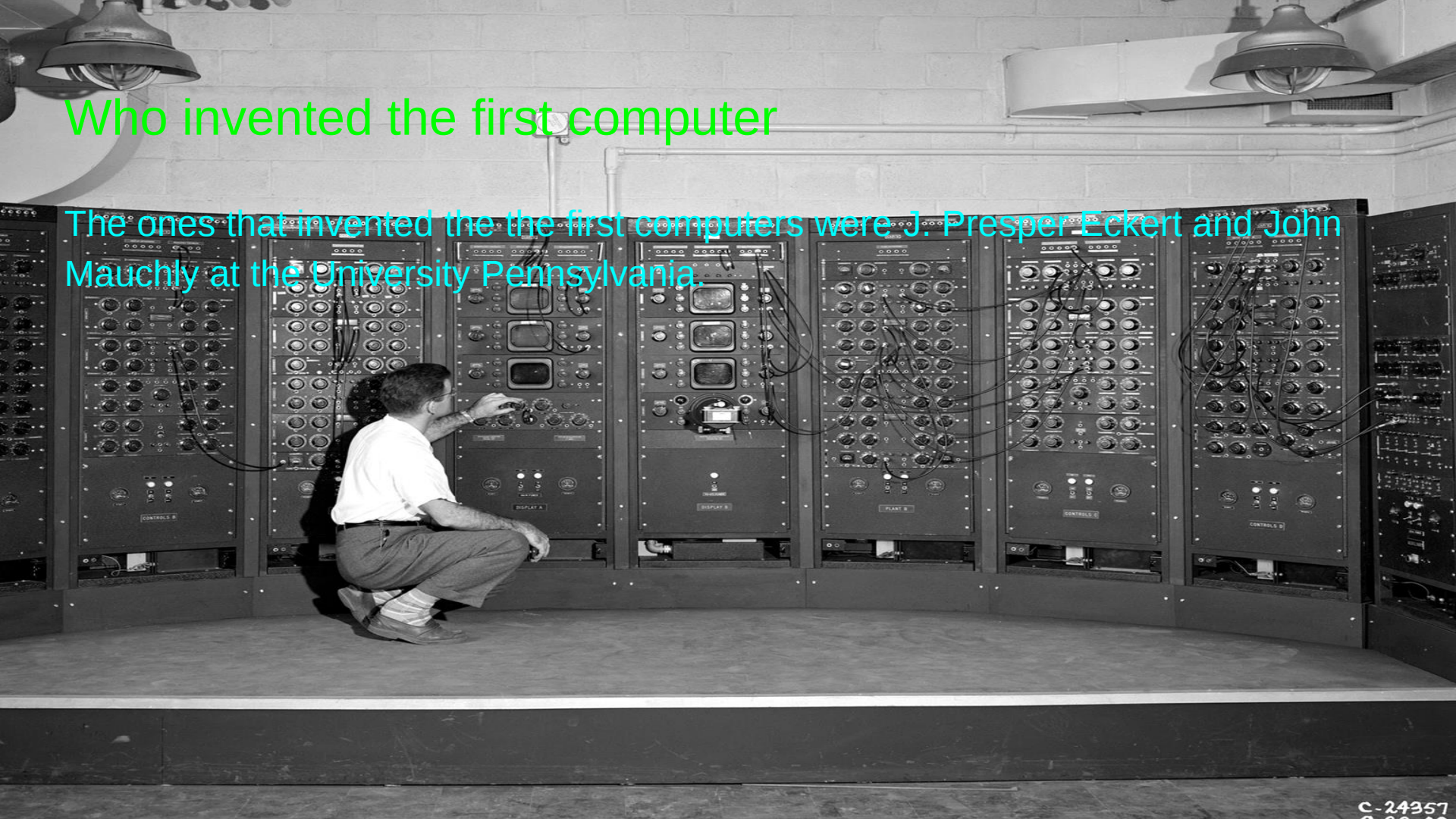
When was the the first computer invented
