Who invented the Model T?

The Model T was invented by Henry Ford, Jozsef Galamb, C. Harold Wills, and Eugene Farkas. The automobile was a self-starting vehicle with a steering wheel on the left side, and with a four-cylinder engine. Covered by vanadium alloy steel despite it's light weight.

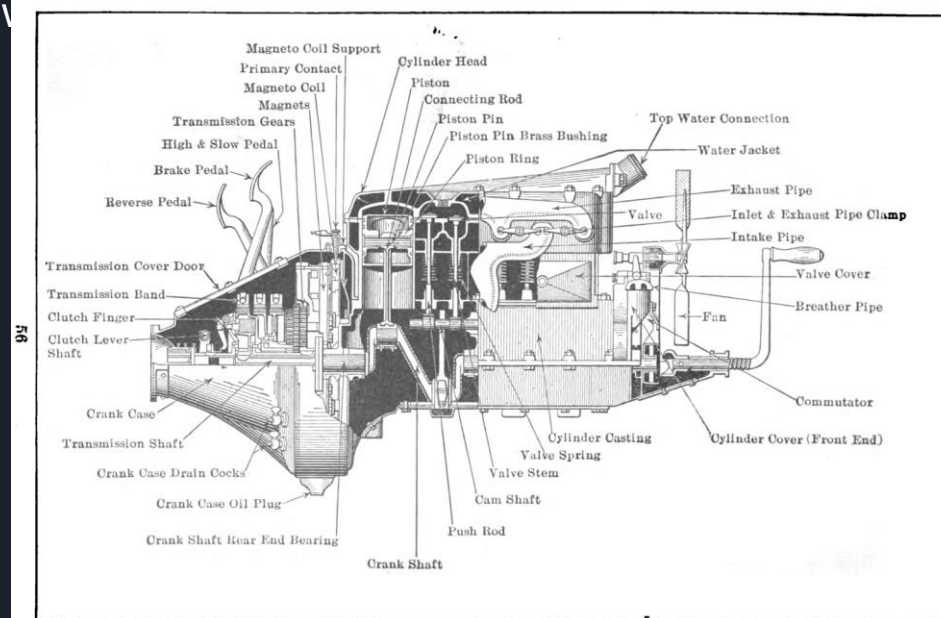


Fig. 11.—Part Sectional View of the Ford Four Cylinder Unit Power Plant Showing Important Parts of the Power Generating and Transmission System.

The Model T was a form of transportation for the people that were poor. It made the live of poor people easier and it also gave jobs opportunities to people who did not have jobs before that invention.



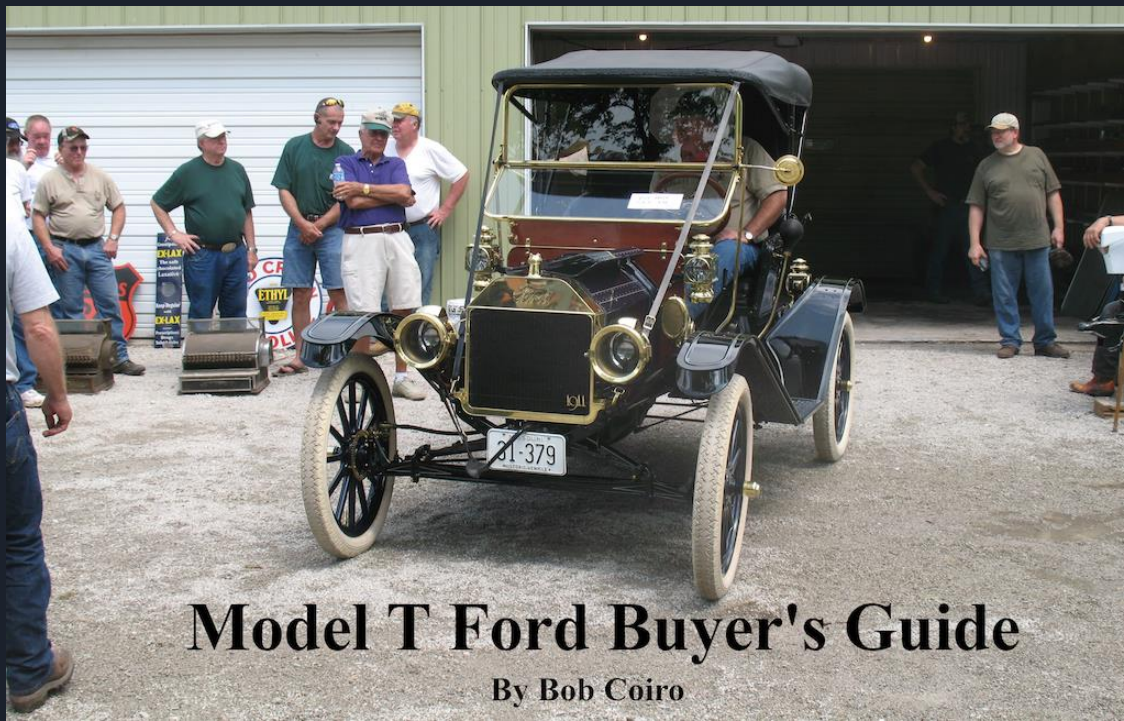
What problem did it solve?
